Remote Learning Policy.

In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March. Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

This meets the expectations set out in the DfE guidance 'Remote Education Support'

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (eg, laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning.

On your child's class Seesaw page you will find an overview of learning to be completed each day.

It will provide learning across the curriculum and children will be expected to spend a similar amount of time completing this as they would spend learning in school.

The Overview.

EYFS / KS1 & KS2

The daily timetable will include:

- Maths - which will include White Rose Maths activities, learning of times tables e.g using TT Rockstars
- Reading - Using the Oxford Owl on line scheme, books at home

- Writing - topic related
- Spelling/Phonics - using Shakespeare for Spelling and Jolly Phonics scheme
- Foundation subject learning linked to the child's topic curriculum

The Oak National Academy.

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home.

Providing feedback

Pupils can send any completed work to teachers by uploading their learning on SeeSaw or via the teacher's school email account Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so.

Contact with pupils/ parents

Parents & Carers are able to contact their child's class teacher via SeeSaw & email. They can also contact the school via telephone or by using the school admin email address office@chidham.w-sussex.sch.uk . Any response should be made within 48 hours. Where a pupil is self-isolating on medical grounds for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by the headteacher and support offered as necessary.

Data protection

When accessing personal data, all staff members will only use their official school email account and connect to the school network using their school laptop only.

Sharing personal data

Staff members are unlikely to need to collect and/or share personal data. However, if it does become necessary, staff are reminded to collect and/or share as little personal data as possible online. All data collection will be compliant with GDPR guidelines.

Keeping devices secure

All staff will take appropriate steps to ensure their devices remain secure. Computers should be locked if left inactive for a period of time. Operating systems must be up to date - always install the latest updates.

Monitoring arrangements

This policy will be reviewed by the SLT as and when updates to home learning are provided by the government. At present the only 'live lessons' will be used via the Oak Academy.
