Maths

As **Mathematicians** the children will build on their understanding of **place value**, adding and subtracting ones, tens and hundreds from 3-digit numbers.

They will add and subtract amounts of **money** to give change, using both pounds and pence in practical contexts.

Creativity – Art/DT/Music

As **Artists** and **Designers** the children will look at examples of patterns and symbols carved by Neolithic people into rocks and consider the tools used, before creating their own cave paintings.

We will experiment with weaving techniques, making bowls for hunting and gathering.

PE

Being active during indoor athletics, children will have the opportunity to develop their existing running, jumping and throwing skills, including throwing for both distance and accuracy. They will be encouraged to try and achieve their personal best.

At Forest School the children will develop their problem-solving skills while participating in Outdoor Adventurous Activities.

Tribal Tales



Literacy

As writers we will be focussing on constructing and improving our sentences and developing our narrative skills by planning and producing our own adventure story. This will enable us to develop our speech writing skills. We will also be empathising with a caveman character and then writing a diary entry from his point of view so we can explore what it would have been like to live at that point in history.



PSHE/RE

In PSHE we will be exploring our school values: friendship, generosity, honesty, perseverance, respect and responsibility to gain a better understanding of their meaning.

As learners about **Religion** the children will explore *What Christians Learn from the Creation Story* and *What Christians mean when they talk about the kingdom of God*.

Science

As **Scientists** the children will be Investigating Do Plants Have legs? Learning how flowers transform into fruits and seeds to perpetuate the cycle of life and discovering their relationship with bees and other insects.

As **Geographers** and **Historians** the children will be examining and understanding the changes that have occurred in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. This will include looking at how skills have developed, weaponry has changed and most importantly how we evolved from hunter-gathers to farmers and traders to sustain our food resources and the impact this had on the environment. We will also look at prehistoric architecture such as Stonehenge.
