

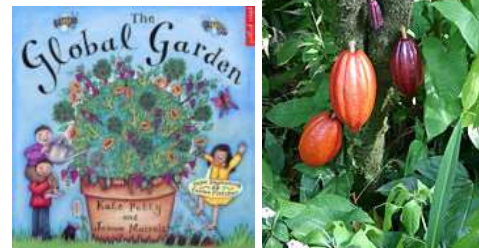
**Maths:** The children will collect and record information about their favourite chocolate bars using tally charts and present their findings in pictograms and bar graphs. To enhance our reasoning and problem solving skills we will interpret the information to answer questions.

We will take part in baking activities which will require us to weigh and measure ingredients accurately, as well as learning to measure length and perimeter using millimetres, centimetres and metres.

**Science:** As scientists the children will discover that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food, they get nutrition from what they eat. They will learn that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

In RE the children will focus on answering the question: Why do Christians call the day Jesus died Good Friday? We will learn about the three important days in holy week, Palm Sunday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday and what they represent, as well as discussing Peter's denial of Jesus and the Last Supper.

**PE:** Indoor - Gymnastics  
Outdoor - Invasion games, Football skills



**Literacy:** Our class text this half term is Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Roald Dahl and we will be writing explanations about the journey of a cocoa bean from its country of origin to becoming a bar of chocolate. The children will learn to use four types of sentences: statement, command, question and exclamation. We will identify the features of clear instructions in recipe books and write our own instructions using imperative verbs to explain how to make a recipe.

**History:** As historians the children will find out about the physician James Lind and consider the lasting effect of his experiments to find the cause of scurvy.

**Geography:** As geographers, we will match pictures of unusual foods to their country of origin, using a world map to locate them.

**PSHE:** (in addition to our work on well being) we will be looking at advertisements and exploring how the media influences our food choices. The children will investigate snack packaging, exploring healthy choices and find out what fair trade goods are and why people buy them.

**Art and DT:** Oak class will be observing and drawing different fruits and vegetables, before exploring the work of Japanese artist Yayoi Kusama. We will then sculpt our own pieces from clay in the style of the artist.
